## **Sample of Clinical Collaboration Plan**

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
Goal: To gradually improve network of affiliations and referral ties over the next two years

## Summary

I am developing a clinical collaboration plan which will gradually improve network of affiliations and referral ties over the next two years. The clinical collaboration plan will develop priorities and actions that will begin implementation in phases. A recent patient survey at the teaching clinic indicated that, friend to friend or word of mouth advertising was the most effective followed by the Internet such as YELP, Google, and clinic website, then the Yellow Pages and Health events. Patients have commented that their healing experience was very positive, staff was friendly and helpful. Most of the patients told me that they had been referred by friends. I am going to try a different approach such as networking with other healthcare professions and building solid referral ties.
